



The delegation of El Espinal is a cultural space dedicated to the preservation, strengthening, and promotion of the cultural identity of our Zapotec ethnic group. It was established in El Espinal, Oaxaca, by the initiative of Dr. Aurelia Benítez Castillejos, Councilwoman of Education and Culture for the Isthmus municipality of El Espinal, with the purpose of promoting the cultural richness of the community among young people and adults.



The cultural group is made up of men and women selected through a recruitment process, all sharing a strong commitment to showcasing Zapotec folklore in different state, national and international forums.

During the Guelaguetza, the most significant celebration of the Oaxacan people, the Guelaguetza Auditorium hosts multiple editions of this festival, presenting the traditions of our people summarized in a cultural artistic program featuring music, dance, clothing, and gastronomy.



In the framework of the Day of the Dead to be held on Sunday, October 27th at the Downey City Theater in California, the proposal “Los Bini Zaas” will be performed in a program of 30 minutes distributed in four acts:

1. Pre-Hispanic Dances
2. Candlelight Night
3. Xhandu´ (The Death)
4. Patron saint’s festival
